Five Years After The Great East Japan Earthquake

March 11 this year makes it five years since the great east Japan earthquake struck. For the past five years most of the infrastructure have been recovered and housing reconstruction is in progress. Medical Grant Assistance for Suleja General Hospital in Niger State

The Government of Japan granted the amount of US\$103,068 (One hundred three thousand and sixty-eight US dollars) under the Japanese Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP) to a local NGO to assist this project.

The staff of Suleja General Hospital had sadly been unable to attend to patients effectively due to lack of adequate equipment.

Recently, they were happy and excited to receive new medical equipment from the Japan government. This included 9 kinds of medical equipment, 12 kinds of medical tools and 13 kinds of furniture.

On the 4th of Febuary, 2016, we celebrated a successful completion of the project at the Embassy of Japan with the attendance of the representatives involved in the project.

Emergency Improvement of Electricity Supply Facilities in Abuja

The Government of Japan has extended the aid of JPY 1.317 billion (equivalent of USD 11.0 million) to improve two substations to provide 7,000 households in the F.C.T with stable power without voltage drop and transmission loss.

There was a signing ceremony of this project on the 11th February, 2016 at the Ministry of Budget and National Planning F.C.T..

Emergency Repair and Overhaul Works for Jebba Hydro Power Station

Japan recently supported the project with an aid of JPY 1.990 billion (equivalent of USD 16.6 million) to repair and overhaul one of the generator units such that it will enable the generator to provide 100MW. Now generator NO.4 has not only recovered its original output but its life span has been increased for at least another 30 years.

The completion ceremony was held at the Jebba Hydro Power Station in Niger state on 15th February,2016.

Educational Grant Assistance For Imoro Community Nursery/ Primary School in Sagamu Local Government Area in Ogun State

The Government of Japan granted the amount of US\$102,761 (One hundred two thousand seven hundred sixty-one US dollars) under the Japanese Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP) to a local NGO to assist this project.

Under the project 1 school building (6 classrooms and 4 toilets) has been constructed, and 138 sets of desks and chairs for students, 7 tables and 8 chairs for teachers have been provided.

The commissioning ceremony for this project was held on Thursday 3rd March 2016, at Imoro Community Nursery/Primary School with lots of excitement from the pupils and the teachers. Representatives from the Embassy of Japan, the implementing development partners, and other stake holders attended.
