**Summary**: In order to response to the humanitarian crisis in Northeast Nigeria, the Government of Japan has extended the aid of 3 million USD through UNDP to implement two projects aimed at creation of stable environment for the people, as well as its humanitarian interventions for on the Internally Displaced person (IDPs). The project of "Early recovery and social cohesion in the North East" aims to contribute to the social stabilization and recovery of the most affected population and communities in Adamawa, Borno and Yobe States by, for example, helping people get engaged in gainful activities such as farming and trading of goods. The other project, "De-radicalization, counter-terrorism and migration project in Northern Nigeria" aims to enhance capacity of security agencies in investigation and prosecution as well as in preventing and tackling irregular migration.
