

As many as 250,000 Ikola Community Residents Can Now Receive Adequate Health Care

The Embassy of Japan announces Ikola Primary Health Care Centre in Alimosho Local Government Area in Lagos State has been completed, commissioned and the facility has since been handed over to the Ikola community by the Ambassador of Japan to Nigeria. The project was implemented by Street-to-School Initiative with the partnership of Kansai Plascon Nigeria in the utilization of a Japanese paint technology by the use of mosquito repellent paint on the walls of the Health Centre to protect in-patients against mosquito infestation, in order to prevent malaria - Ambassador Kikuta, Representative of Governor of Lagos State, Commissioner for wealth creation and employment and local residents were present at the commissioning ceremony. As a result of this project, 250,000 local residents will benefit from the Ikola Primary Health Centre
